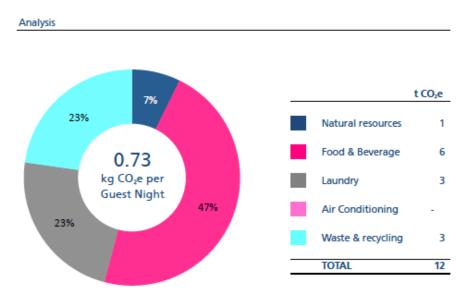


### Hostelling International CO<sub>2</sub>e-REPORT 2012

#### CO2e-Report

This carbon footprint takes into consideration all consumption relevant for the operation of the hostel during one year. The data is based on the hostel's self-declaration in the Excel Questionnaire; the entries have been audited for plausibility by myclimate.



CO<sub>2</sub> is the most important greenhouse gas, but by no means the only one. Other emissions, such as methane or nitrous oxide, are also taken into account and converted into CO<sub>2</sub> equivalents (abbreviated as CO<sub>2</sub>e). This carbon footprint shows all relevant greenhouse gases calculated in CO<sub>2</sub>e.

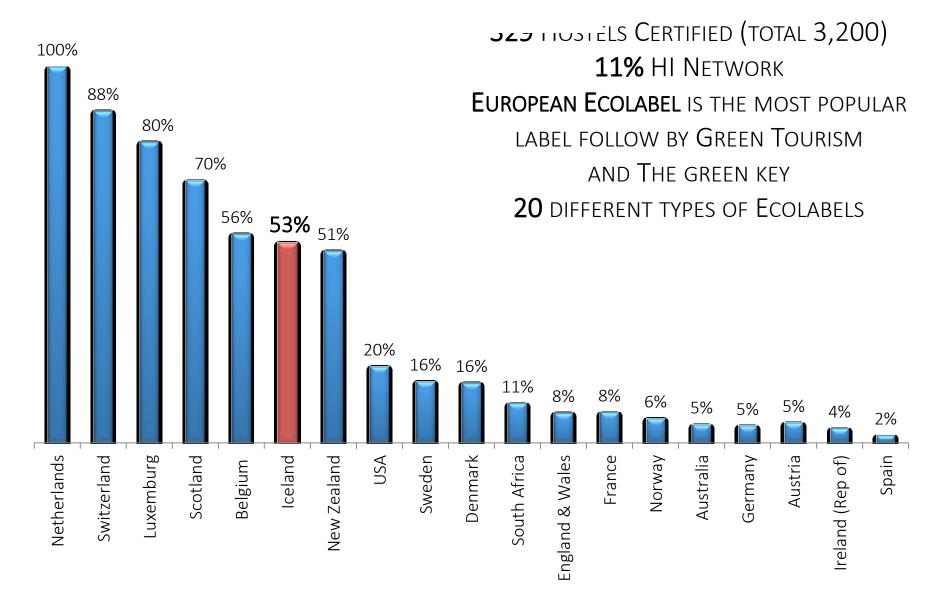

Iceland is a perfect hostel destination and a country full to the brim with spectacular scenery dotted with cascading waterfalls, lush forest, soaring mountains and geothermal wonders. It's a perfect gateway for those looking to escape into the tranquility of wilderness. Plenty of animals call this location home, so you can be sure of some spectacular wildlife sightings, too. Myvath Lake is thousands of years old and was formed by a volcanic eruption - these days it's home to a huge variety of bird species. The vilage of Grundarfjörður may be small, but it's surrounded by imposing mountains and its waters are often visited by humpback whales and orcas. Ósar's coastal waters are frequented by the largest colony of seals in Iceland and fished by a diversity of birds, including puffins. After a day of hiking, kayaking or sea-angling, you may be lucky enough to see the majestic Northern Lights dancing across the sky.

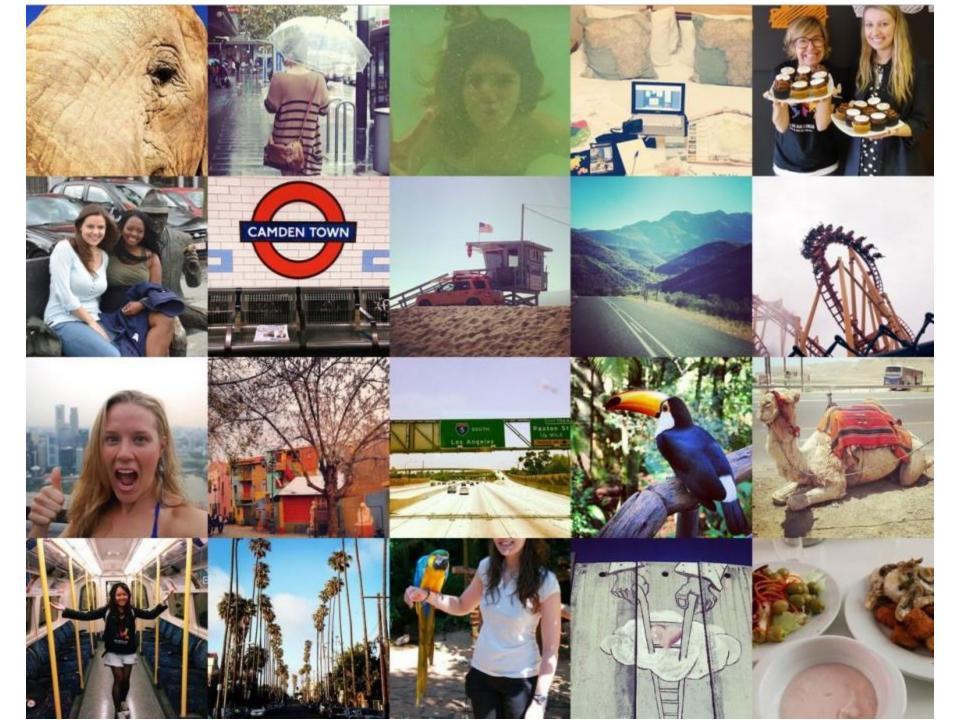
